Christian Kluttz and North Carolina Win at Las Vegas



Matthew McKnight continues to battle pancreatic cancer and he asks for continued prayers. Ronnie Miller is serving as an interim at this time.



CMU Checkoff Assessments start April 1st 2023!

The Newly Federal Mandated CMU Checkoff Program is kicking into high gear nationwide for all CMU producers. Starting April 1st, all CMU producers will be required to have safe harbor language added to all invoices pertaining to the penny assessment for CMU sold. The penny per block assessment will be collected at the point of sale. All producers will be required to send in the assessments on a quarterly basis.


