The 7th Annual Masonry Education bay in Gold Hill, NC was a huge success! Thanks to all of the vendors and SPEC MIX for making this day successful. Masonry Education Day was held on October 5 at Stalite's, Ben Ketchie Park in Gold Hill, NC. With a total of 762 brick laid in one hour, the team of mason Grant Helms of Helms Masonry Inc. and Michael Ridenhour won the October Carolina Qualifier for the upcoming 2024 Las Vegas <u>SPEC MIX Bricklayer 500</u> World Championship. Grant will be making a return trip to Las Vegas having also qualified in 2023 with the "Wild Card." The regional qualifier was part of the Seventh Annual Masonry Education Day at Stalite's Ben Ketchie Park in Gold Hill. Over seven hundred students from across North Carolina participated in hands-on exhibits and competitions, met potential employers, and enjoyed a hotdog lunch provided by Johnson Concrete Products. In the qualifier, the team of David Kelly with tender Nick Campbell placed 2nd and took home Top Craftsman. Keith Helms with tender Scott Helms (both of Helms Masonry Inc.) placed third. The East Rowan High School team of Mason Ridenhour with tender Wyatt Trexler won the Jr. <u>SPEC MIX Bricklayer 500</u> with a brick count of 315, followed by mason Corbin Nations and tender Mark Truman of West Rowan High School in second place and the North Stanly High School team of mason Coleson Palmer and tender Jesse Thompson in third place.

In Memory of Jimmy Harrell

On December 13th, we lost one of the giants of the Carolinas' Masonry Industry. Jimmy Miles Harrell was 84 and lived in Stoneville. A past president of the Carolinas Concrete Masonry Association (now the Southeastern Concrete Masonry Association,) Jimmy was a positive spokesman for masonry, serving on state and national promotion, production, and workforce development committees, and served on committees that developed codes and standards for masonry construction. For many years, he chaired the National Masonry Skills Championship contest for what is now SkillsUSA and was one of the industry leaders who helped the North Carolina State Masonry Championship Contest become the strongest high school masonry competition in the nation. Jimmy was an accomplished journeyman mason and was often a "lone-voice" speaking up for the practical skills side of the masonry trade among the "academics." His wealth of knowledge was the culmination of years of field experience both as a mason and as a material manufacturer and provider. In his later years, Jimmy was often called upon to work with engineering firms to provide "forensic" studies of masonry building problems regularly working with engineer Rob Kennerly. Rob and Jimmy partnered to do several continuing education sessions for the NCMCA Certification program and for training sessions of the Virginia Blue Ridge Masonry Association. Jimmy, along with Charles Newsome and other masonry industry leaders worked with NC State University School of Architecture Professor Patrick Rand to create the NC State Design Guild to help ensure future designers would be provided a positive introduction to masonry in school. Professor Rand says of Jimmy, "He was one of those landmark (individuals) in the lives of many." As a masonry contractor and as a material supplier, Jimmy was a fierce competitor, but he never shied away from an opportunity to assist anyone, including competitors, in the name of promoting and improving the masonry industry. The masonry industry in North Carolina is the envy of the nation. Jimmy Harrell gets a great deal of the credit for that fact. For those of you who know Jimmy, I'll leave you with a fun memory; the punchline from one of his favorite stories: "At that price, there ain't gonna be no manure..." Rest in Peace Jimmy. The Shoulders We Stand Upon: In July, NCMCA gathered several of our more "senior" industry leaders for a session to record their thoughts and recollections about the evolution of the industry and their stories about the larger-than-life personalities masonry has produced here in the Carolinas. Participants included, left to right, NCMCA's Ryan Shaver; Charles Newsome (82,) past-president of both the Southeast Concrete Masonry Association (CCMA) and the National Concrete Masonry Association, recently retired from Johnson Concrete Products/Carolina Stalite after fifty years with the firm; Jimmy Harrell (80,)journeyman mason, respected material supplier, masonry consultant and a past president of the Southeast Concrete Masonry Association, who hosted the meeting at his home Stoneville; NCMCA President Kent Huntley; and NC State University School of Architecture Professor Patrick Rand, who worked with both Harrell and Newsome when they all served together on the board of the NC State Design Guild. Curtis Laughlin (89,) retired from Carolina Quality Block and a member of the National Concrete Masonry Association's Hall-of-Fame joined in the session via speakerphone. In the spring, Mr. Harrell presented NCMCA with his red VICA/SkillsUSA jacket that holds all his state and national competition campaign pins from his years as Chairman of the National Masonry Contest, including 1993, the year Ryan Shaver won the national competition. 

Checkoff Update

The SCMA has had a highly successful year. We've seen our membership grow five years in a row! We have seen the expansion of our university programs, AIA, CSI and SEA chapter and state programs. We continue to strengthen the bridges with our workforce development partners in all five states. The SCMA truly believes the industry will continue to unify and rally behind the checkoff program. Just last month, the CMCB conditionally approved all 23 programs recommended for funding by the national Programs Committee and RACs, to the tune of nearly \$5 million! Here in region 2, all programs were funded for an investment of \$1,570,400. That's quite an accomplishment to see the bulk of the funding for regional programs was awarded to region 2! Here is a summary of the awarded programs.

Workforce Development

Task Group Lead – Ryan Shaver Program Support Entity – NC Mason Contractors Association Checkoff Funding - \$305,000

Replicate the successful NC workforce development program throughout Region 2. This program will include getting federal Department of Labor recognition of high school education programs that include on the job learning, competency demonstrations and project-based learning curriculum. Deliverables will include a best practices guide, education and certification content for instructors, 10/30 hour OSHA courses at regional centers and will maintain a national masonry curriculum.

University Education and Research

Task Group Lead – James Cain Program Owner – Southeast Concrete Masonry Association Checkoff Funding - \$150,000 Other Secured Funding - \$20,000

Create a first of its kind forum targeting 45 universities in

region two aimed to gain insights and provide education into what academic institutions seek from industry partnerships and create a masonry/university network system. All-expense paid for universities to attend. Part of this goal will be to help identify future masonry research topics and identify universities willing to participate. We will also create the first of its kind Industry Mentor Members Workshop focused on providing training to preidentified producers who demonstrate the willingness to work with local universities in their local communities.

Educate Design Professionals

Task Group Lead – Byard Stevens Program support entity to be determined. Checkoff Funding - \$200,000 This program will increase CMU industry visibility and awareness with AIA Partners through the development of AIA programs and establishing partnerships with the top 10 AIA chapters in the region. The program will Build a pathway to educating design professions and the AEC Community with a goal of reaching 1200 design professions in year one through a combination of virtual and in person events.

Marketing

Task Group Lead – David Cerniglia Program Owner Matt Sitter, Florida Concrete Products Association

Checkoff Funding - \$600,000

Expand Florida's BlockStrong program throughout the other 7 states in the region to create BlockStrong Southeast. The program will create a new BlockStrong Southeast website and use digital marketing and social media throughout the region to educate consumers and developers on the superior benefits of concrete block construction, drive demand for concrete block through end user marketing strategies and increase sales and market share of concrete block across SF/MF Residential and Commercial market segments.

Design Assistance-Masonry Framed Homes

Task Group Lead – James Cain

Program Support – James Cain, Southeast Concrete Masonry Association

Checkoff Funding - \$50,000

Create a platform demonstrating the digital world of masonry framed homes including the sub elements of HVAC, Electrical and Plumbing. Year one is geared to R&D of this program only. Our long-term goal will be future interactive resources and training for builders and subcontractors on how to effectively build Masonry Framed Homes.

Codes and Standards Advocacy

Task Group Lead – Michelle White Program Owner – Florida Independent Concr

Program Owner – Florida Independent Concrete and Associated Products Checkoff Funding \$265,000

Other Secured Funding \$65,000

Model the Florida codes and standards program throughout the Southeast. Hire 2 consultants to service districts 4 (VA, NC, SC) and 5 (MS, TN, AL, GA). The consultants will be responsible for advancing the competitive position of masonry through improvements to building codes. The specific goals may vary from one state to another based on local regulations and building codes currently in place, climate conditions and other considerations. A codes professional, specific to District/State, will work to promote the various advantages of masonry to the built environment while forging alliances with industry associations, government agencies and other organizations that share an interest in advancing building codes.
